Chair's Report 4.0

Opening Remarks:

JB thanked all club volunteers for their contributions.



 Membership revenue increased by 16% in 2024, with approximately 400 members and 190 EA licences held.

Performance Highlights:

- Men's team achieved promotion to Division 2 of the Surrey Cross-Country League.
- George James set a new marathon club record (2h 11m 19s) and was selected for the English team at the European Running Championships.
- Alice Crane set new club records in 1500m, 3000m, 5000m, 5k, and 10k, and represented England in Italy for hill running. Alice has resigned from the club but will continue as a second-claim member.
- o 19 women's and 14 men's club records set in total.
- Howard Jones awarded Club Person of the Year and Linda Davey as Unsung Hero at the Christmas dinner.

Coaching Updates:

- Loss of coaches including Rob and Rachel Russell, Josh Gorecki, Ken
 Caldwell and also Linda Davey in the summer impacting youth coaching.
- New volunteer coaches are being trained: Dan Evans, Mark Fitzgerald,
 Abie Helberg, David Moore, Ian Giles, and Sharmy Blows.
- Current coaching team Nick Seamann, Howard Jones, Richard Grassley and Chris Parrott, Dawn Cook, Chris Edwards, Kevin Irvine, Linda Davey, Alison Jackson and Brian James. Still room for more coaches – especially for youth.
- It may take 12 months to fully recover from the loss of five fully qualified coaches.

- Competed in Division 1 of the Surrey Cross-Country League, finishing 15th out of 15.
- Strong individual performances from Alice Crane.
- Next year would be great to get more runners out races are free and friendly for everyone.

Men's Team:

- Notable performances by Dan Evans, Pat Wright, Howard Jones, Matthew Cluett, Dan Jeffries, Kev Stroud, Charles Wheeler and Dennis Earl.
- Team promoted to Division 2 in the Surrey Cross-Country League.

Expenses

- o Pixham £1800 up on last yr
- Hire of facilities costs St Martins have seen a change in management which resulted in a change to the invoicing rota
- NT lost some of cheques so cost of donations for use of Ranmore is higher
- o Equipment battery for defib, purchase of air shelter etc
- Investment in people entry fees cost has gone up
- o Repairs and maintenance at Pixham include painting track, field
- Healthy bank balance for plan to have funds in place for eventual all-weather track





- Secure environment able to pay for training fees for coaches.
- Question raised Interest earned could it be moved to higher interest account. ACTION: PH made note to investigate

8.0 Membership Fee Proposal

After discussion at committee level, committee recommend hold fees for 3rd yr in a row. Going back 5-6 years, it was £40 so little very little increase over years but balance is strong.

Family membership - 19 family memberships in 2024 although only approx. 9 families could be affected. It will make membership easier to manage. Affected families should approach Membership Secretary for help. Families with 2 adults members and 2 children would be mostly affected.

- Individual Adult Member (over 25) £45.00
- Young Adult Membership for 18-25yr old £30.00 (must be 25 and under on April 1st)
- Youth membership U11 £40.00
- Youth Membership 11- 18yrs (EA licence compulsory and included) TOTAL £60.00
- Second claim members £30.00
- The EA licence has been confirmed as £20.00.
- Part way through year memberships:
 - o Full fee payable for first 6 months
 - Available for all memberships October to March at a monthly prorata discount rate – NOTE: EA Licence is £20 and not subject to prorata discount.
 - Can be reviewed on a case by case basis
- Family Membership no longer available but as always, members can approach the membership secretary to request any special arrangements for payments.

Looking at next year – committee are trying to run at break even. This does mean that we can spend money when we need. Aim is to keep any surplus as small as possible.

JB confirmed cost of Pixham and the grounds may not be quite as much next year.

The cost of running Pixham is £60k each year – cost of £14k to sand and seed in 2024 – but will be only £8k in 2025. Also, solar panels reducing costs. Refuse collection cost has gone down

• Current Membership System:



- Webcollect is outdated and cumbersome
- Difficult to manage effectively

• Exploring New Systems:

- Considered 3-4 alternative options
- Focused on two main options: Coacha and Membermojo (used by Epsom Oddballs)
- o Committee is currently evaluating both systems

Expected Improvements:

- o Improved payment system using Stripe
- o Ability for members to update their own data
- o Coaches and Run Leaders to have online access to athlete data
- o Session run registers, particularly for youth sessions
- Enhanced club communications

Current Communication Tools:

o WhatsApp improvements have been effective; no plans to replace it

System Feedback:

- o Coacha appeared promising but didn't fully meet requirements
- Likely decision to switch systems this year

Potential Membership Renewal Delay:

- o Renewal may be delayed to early May
- Members would complete a form, pay, and be assigned to appropriate groups (adult/youth)

System Costs:

Webcollect: £410/yearCoacha: £36/monthMembermojo: £95/year

Each system has transaction fees

Additional Features:

- Automated email reminders for unpaid fees
- o EA (England Athletics) compliance is crucial for safeguarding
- o New system will facilitate EA Licence payments

Appendix 1

Senior Most Improved Awards

Most improved woman - Ria Woodfield

Ria Woodfield had a superb season in 2024 returning to times she was achieving some years ago with a 20:16 park run and a 42:22 10k. Her range is impressive as Ria will tackle anything from 5k to ultra distances.

She is also a strong cross-country runner and regularly turned out for the club in the Surrey League Division 1 matches, as well as competing in The South of Thames Team Championships and the Surrey Masters.

Cross-Country 2025 has started well for Ria as evidenced by the Hereford 10 mile race she ran in February and last Sunday's Leith Hill Half Marathon.

At Hereford Ria recorded a time of 69:18 to place her third woman and first in her age group. In the Leith Hill half she placed second woman with a time of 1 h 46 min. Will continue to go from strength to strength in 2025.

Most improved man - Dan Evans

Dan Evans has made great progress this year. He finished second overall in the Surrey Road League competition, and in the 2024-25 cross-country league races placed 3rd in Race 1, 2nd in Race 3 and then picked up his maiden victory in Race 4, helping the team significantly to promotion for next season.

Dan has also stepped up to train as a coach from this year and will help coach Rob Russell's group now he has left Dorking.
